Also our senior most member **Joy de Silva** ~is also yet unwell


We wish them both a Speedy Magical Recovery !!

Alexander Herrmann (Born: February 11, 1843. Died: December 17, 1896)

Alexander Herrmann's 115th death anniversary fell on Dec.17th

The following tribute to the memory of Alexander Herrmann by Albert Bighlow Paine; appeared in the New York Journal, December 19th, 1896: (from the book "Magician's Handbook: Tricks And Secrets Of The World's Greatest Magician Herrmann The Great "by H.J. Burlingame)

## Entertaining Children Magically!

With the spread of International Schools in the Western Province, especially in the Colombo District more and more kids in the Primary Divisions, wish to celebrate their birthdays in a more grandeur scale than the ones they were invited before! In the last ten years demand for Magic Shows has grown by leaps & bounds. The majority of the children wish to have naturally, the traditional magician amidst them. Parents often search for a suitable magician. So they try to get recommendation from friends, some try the Internet or the yellow pages. Most go by recommendations received through word of mouth advertisements. Really a popular magician may not like to advertise in any of the above, but relies on word of mouth advertisement. Further since requests for magic shows are rare for the not too professional magician the quotation would naturally be very low too. Perhaps such a person may not be able to present lively tricks audibly too! Remember the old saying "Good things are not Cheap & Cheap things are not Good"!!

So how does one pick a magician who would keep the party lively? Of course the magician who uses patter with wit, able to create laughter, superb presentation, interacting with the children and even the adults present, scores heavily! By speaking to the magician over the telephone one could gauge his quality. Perhaps he would have a profile to be presented or even DVDs to promote himself if he is not within the classification of a top magician. All magicians cannot handle kids. Kids these days are noisy and may even heckle a performer. Then the magician should understand human psychology and use his skills & dexterity to overcome such hurdles. This goes by experience over the years. Not every magician is the right kind! The magician who handles kids with expertise and able to keep them spell bound would naturally earn the respect of the kids and the adults present, who wish to see the magician baffle them!


A magician should be careful in selecting his routine or props. He should avoid dangerous tricks where kids would like to experiment with, namely using Fire Effects. Releasing a rope tied round one's neck, Swollowing Blades & pulling them back as a strand from the mouth. Children like to experiment such tricks which could end in disaster! Children love to see instant colourful and flashy effects and will not

sit and watch a card trick which takes a long time to conclude. Avoid boring long effects. Presentation of Magic without livestock like doves & rabbits becomes uninteresting & boring. Misdirection too helps the magician to score well, since children today watch a magician very closely. A good magician is one who is attired in a magician's costume and one who uses soft back ground lilting music and one who has his clean & colourful props well laid out.

A magician should always go prepared even with his tables, back ground music, spot lamp, electricity wire cords, plug tops & rear curtain drops if possible and should not worry the host or hostess. He should be present at least 30 minutes before his act to set up. It would also be advantageous to even recce the site before hand to ensure the perfect place for the presentation. If not on arrival he should be able to convince the host / hostess of the right place to set up. Proper lighting too is very essential by dusk. The maximum time for a kids birthday party should not more than 40 minutes.

## Tongest standing member of the SIMC and the Most experienced Magician of Sri Janka



It, Col. Ronald De Alwis

Lt. Col. Ronald de Alwis, known to all of us at SLMC as "Ronnie" or "Ronnie Uncle" completes 60 years as a member of the SLMC on 8th January 2012. When he joined as a member in 1952 he was just a lad of 16 years. By that time he was already a performing magician. Clad in shirt and shorts he gave his first magic show in 1947. The event was the prizegiving at his Alma Mater, St. Mary's College Chilaw and the audience numbered around 500. He was just 12 years old. The magic bug that bit him at that time has stayed with him ever since. He was introduced to magic by his father Linden who used to perform under the name of Prof. Dalvo. Linden de Alwis was one of the founder members of the SLMC (formerly known as the Association of Ceylon Magicians).

Ronnie has won many awards in his long magical career. He was the Runner-up in the Junior section in the Magic Competition conducted by the famous impresario the great Donovan Andree. In 1962 he became Magician of the Year. In 1968 he won the first ever Open Contest and the Comedy Magic Award too. In the year 2004, recognizing his contribution to the art of magic, Ronnie was awarded the Kalabushana Award by the Cultural Ministry. The first Magician to receive this award.

The services rendered by Ronnie over the years to the upliftment of the SLMC has been immense and too numerous to enumerate. However one particular contribution should be mentioned. In 2002 the SLMC received the gift of a plot of land at Kalapura, Mount Lavinia through the untiring efforts of him. The SLMC building which stands in these premises is undoubtedly a monument to his love for the SLMC and magic in general.

Let us felicitate this great magical character.
